

- Teaching and preparing students:
 - ✓ To think and act as an academic skilled person
 - ✓ *Preparing students, both for:*
 - An academic and research oriented career and/or...
 - An industry oriented career
- Taking in account:
 - ✓ Transforming from "5 + 1" → "4 + 2" → <u>Content</u> of the e-books
 - ✓ Digital learning environment \rightarrow <u>Moodle</u> as a platform to "facilitate"
 - ✓ International oriented → English language



Embedding the learning process in a Learning Environment: → Model:



- The **learning objectives** for each course need to be formulated:
 - ✓ knowledge, attitudes, skills, ... to be reached
 - the teacher as well as the student need <u>a clear objective, a clear</u> <u>reference</u>
- The **student characteristics** are important:
 - ✓ prior knowledge, motivation, interests, age, ...
 - the teacher as well as the student need to know <u>where to start</u> <u>from...</u>
- The student needs to be evaluated (assessment):
 - ✓ formative and summative, ... when, what, how,...
 - The <u>assessment</u> needs to be <u>representative</u> in relation to the learning objectives




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Digitizing the content of courses *makes it possible* to apply a digital learning platform, such as Moodle, and to:

- ✓ Adjust and elaborate the course content
- ✓ Structure and re-structure the content, while adapting to
 - > The learning outcomes
 - The students needs
 - > The students' learning process

On the other hand, a learning platform *remains only a tool*,

... to be used by the student... and the teacher/tutor.



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Digital Learning Environment

- A Digital Learning Environment allows to:
 - provide students with study material of different types (for example e-books)
 - interact with the students synchronously and asynchronously
 - follow the evolution of the learning process
 - observe the performance of a student in specific tasks



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Digital Learning Environment

- A Digital Learning Environment is known to be useful when teaching 'science' and 'physics'.
- Objects of *many kinds* can be used:
 - Text documents
 - Videos & Images
 - Links to websites
 - Animations
 - Simulations
 - 0 ...



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Digital Learning Environment

- A Digital Learning Environment provides *many useful tools*:
 - ✓ Uploading of course materials i.e. course content
 - ✓ Learning paths
 - ✓ Questionnaires + quizzes
 - ✓ (Peer) assessment
 - Communication, including chat sessions and forums
 - ✓ Wikis and blogs
 - ✓ Tools for tracking students
 - Feedback to the students
 - ✓ Administration of groups (managing the teaching & tutoring...).

Preparing the Electronic Books...

In order to apply the digital learning platform:

- The electronic books need to be structured, e.g.:
 - Defining chapters to be studied
 - Preparing Questionnaires & Quizzes (for each chapter/...)
 - Additional learning materials (video's, simulations,...)
- Defining (writing) for each electronic book/chapter/...:
 - The student's prerequisite knowledge & competences
 - > The learning outcomes
 - > The assessment of the students: when, how,...
